

# **Short Period Homestay Families Required**

Kurnai College will be hosting a Chinese Study group for our sister school Jiyun Experimental School in July this year. We are looking for families who would be interested in hosting a Chinese student/s for up to a week.

While at Kurnai, they will be participating in a mix of English Language classes located at the University Campus and immersion classes at the Junior Campuses. These classes will be followed up by organised afternoon activities within the local area.

The Homestay is to provide a welcoming, nurturing and safe environment for young students, as it will likely be the first time these students have been out of China. If possible, it may pay to consider having two students billeted with your family making it less daunting and easier for you and the students.

Hosting an international student is very rewarding and offers a wonderful opportunity to learn about a new culture and share our Australian way of life. This would be a great opportunity to consider for our students who are currently studying Mandarin or have/will be participating in our trips to China.

Host families are paid a nominal fee of \$30.00 per night per student, which is to assist with food, accommodation and transportation as required for students that are living with them.

the classroom and exposed to all the instructions then they will have a much better understanding than if they have to catch up on the lesson later without the benefit of the discussion that goes with all instructions. There is no substitute for being in the class for the lesson.

Good attendance habits are formed early by a regular pattern which begins the night before. Going to bed early enough to get a good night sleep, not being on social media till very late, making sure there is an effective wake up routine, preparing what is needed for the next day etc, will all help your student to get to school fully prepared for the day ahead.

Obviously there will be times when illness occurs in the family. At these times a student is better off getting better before returning to school than coming to school sick and possibly affecting others. When this occurs contact the school and let us know. Your student can access Compass for work which should be there so at least they can do something from home.

Please discuss the importance of attending school everyday with your student because its Not OK To Be Away and missing school will affect their ability to learn.

All staff are aware that they must take any incident reported to them seriously and not make personal judgements about whether a report is true or false. They must follow the procedures as set out in the Kurnai College Child Safe Policy. We are totally committed to child safety at our college.


