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Message from Campus Principal

Hello Everyone,

The last few days have been a particularly difficult time for our community. This is a message from acting College Principal, Matt Jobling:

Budgeree bushfire that impacted and threatened a number of our local communities. Both the University Campus and campus principal." Licola Lions Club Wilderness Camp

On Monday 25th February, 14 students from the Foundation VCAL class set off on a journey where they would perform acts of kindness and give back to the Licola Wilderness Village, whilst also having the opportunity to challenge themselves and gain more confidence and skills in leadership and team building. Students worked hard to carry out minor repairs to the facilities, as well as assisting with the clean up of branches and leaves around the main camp site and facilities. Students through these activities, were able gain a greater understanding on the importance of helping others to make a difference. Our students learnt that small acts of kindness can not only help others, but can provide a rewarding feeling to the person who helps out.

In addition to working around the village students then had to challenge their own personal fears and step out of their own personal comfort zone. Students had the chance to climb a number of different rock climbing walls, test their fear on the giant swing or just take on the zip line. Working together each of our students encouraged others to conquer their fears. Our final activity was the team canoeing challenge, where students worked together to canoe in the Macalister River. Canoeing had its own challenges with students and staff managing to capsize and complete rescues in the water to regain their canoeing position.

Our VCAL Foundation students not only experienced all of this fun and adventure, but they also had the task of catering for each other to meet one of their VET outcomes. Prior to leaving students worked in teams to prepare a meal planner and at camp were able to test out their meal plan and cook for the whole team. Students did a fabulous job of preparing and cooking nutritious meals.



Throughout this experience our students have been able to gain greater strength in their own personal journey in VCAL and learn the importance of team building and positive and growth mindsets. Students from this experience are able to start to build upon their job readiness skills that the VCAL program endeavors to educate them on. Debutante Ball 2019

Parents & Carers of students planning to do the Debutante Ball in 2019 need to be aware that as the Deb Ball is an external event to the normal school curriculum, conditions are placed on student participation.

One of these conditions is that families with outstanding charges must be brought up to date before their child can begin dance lessons in preparation for the Deb Ball.

This does not include the College's yearly school charges but only costs that should have already been paid such as outstanding balances for camps and excursions, extra curriculum music costs or charges relating to damage of school property.

Additionally, full payment for the Deb MUST be made by the 17th April.

In addition to payments made at the campus office, the College offers both Centrepay and Bpay options as a method of payment. Centrepay allows families to have fortnightly amounts automatically deducted from any Centrelink payments.

Due to the number of students expressing their interest this year, unfortunately there will be no flexibility in this matter.

If you have any concerns or wish to organise a payment plan please don't hesitate to contact the campus office. Any payment plans must be put in place by 21st March.



Attention ALL 2019 Year 11 and 12 students,

Would you like to attend the Mt Hotham Camp in 2019? - 4 spots available

Mt Hotham is a well-known ski resort approximately 4-5 hours drive from Churchill via Omeo. The main activities undertaken on the camp will be downhill skiing and/or snowboarding.

The camp will run from Sunday 7th July to Friday 12th July. Students must be at the University Campus bus stop at 10.00am on the Sunday. We intend to return to Kurnai College (University Campus) at approximately 9.00pm on the Friday. Students will be staying at a Ski Lodge located at the top of the mountain. The total cost of the camp will be **approximately** \$1650.00 which includes:

- Resort entries
- Accommodation
- All meals
- Lift
- Lessons
- Night skiing on Wednesday evening
- Ski/Snowboard Hire including carve skis, boots and poles or board and boots
- Transport to and from Mount Hotham
- Hotham hoodie jumper

Students will need to pay a deposit of \$300 if they would like to secure a position for the camp. We have organised a payment plan in an effort to give families the opportunity to finalise the full payment by 2.00pm on Friday 21st June 2019. While we understand this is an expensive camp we strongly believe that this is the most economical way of giving students the opportunity to participate in Alpine Snow sports. All students who participate in this camp will come home exhausted and thoroughly satisfied with their experiences, bubbling with stories of the thrills and spills they encountered.

In order for this camp to proceed we require a minimum of 20 students to attend and will cap the attendance at 25 students. In the event of us not receiving enough interest, we will have to cancel this camp and, in this instance only, your deposit will be refunded.

Students are expected to have a good behaviour history and an average or above average fitness level. Parents will be notified if their child is in danger of losing their invitation to camp due to poor behaviour at school. These decisions will be made by the Principal, in consultation with the advocate team and Camp Coordinator.

Additional information will be provided to your child as time gets closer to ensure your child is properly equipped for the camp. Their safety and comfort will depend on this. If students don't have the required equipment they may be able to borrow a snow jacket and pants or alternatively this clothing can be hired from Mt Hotham.

Ambulance membership is highly recommended as a trip in an ambulance from Mt Hotham can cost thousands of dollars if you are a non-member. We also recommend travel insurance for an additional cost.

Term 3 Practice Exams

At Kurnai College we work to ensure that every student achieves their full potential when students leave us at the end of the year. We want to make sure they are ready to take on every opportunity that is provided for them. In order to help achieve this, practice examinations will take place during the Term 3 holidays so students know what to expect for their final exams. All students who are completing a Unit 3 and 4 subject this year are expected to attend their practice examinations during this holiday period where they will be provided with the experience of undertaking exams in similar conditions as their final ones at the end of October. Once these exams are completed students will receive detailed feedback on their results as well as areas to improve upon. This will help your child to develop a revision plan as well as provide further development of skills ready for their final exam.

A timetable for practice exams will be given out in Term 2 to allow students the opportunity to organise time for their exams as well as holiday lectures and general revision time during this holiday period.
