I am sure we are all well and truly looking forward to the holidays! It is important for us all to relax and recharge our batteries so that we can take on term four, which is shaping up to be very busy.

There are still a few things on our calendar before we head into the September break. Students are completing their final assessments, the Common Assessment Tasks (CATs), for term 3 in each of their classes. Through their collaboration meetings, teachers modified and adjusted the CATs, taking into consideration the constraints and impact of Remote Learning on our students.

The current restrictions prevent us from holding Parent/Teacher Conversations on-site however they will still be held via a phone call or a Teams call. Parents and carers will be able to book a catch-up time via Compass, as per our usual system. Parent/Teacher conversations are scheduled for:

Thursday, September 16th 3.30 – 6.30 pm & Friday, September 17th 10.00 am -12.00pm.

Classes will run as normal on Thursday, however there will be no online classes on Friday. The Care & Supervision Program will run for students who are currently attending the program

The school day will end at 1.00 pm on Friday and country buses will pick up at 1.30 pm.

Students in Year 7 and 9 have now received their individual **NAPLAN** reports. Together, classroom teachers, Learning Specialists, Team Leaders and Principals from across the College analyse the data and discuss trends in the data, strengths and areas for improvement and most importantly the learning supports we will put in place for our students.

Congratulations to all students for 'Doing their best on the NAPLAN test' despite the challenging and difficult time the previous eighteen months has been.

I wish you all a restful and relaxing holiday and looking forward to seeing you all in person, soon.

Planned for first week of Term 4, online, but hopefully at their facility.








'You guys are awesome!'
