Message from our Campus Principal

Welcome Back to Term 3

Welcome back to the beginning of Term 3. It was great to see our students return last week and ready to tackle what traditionally feels like the longest term of the year. The mornings are cold and dark and the lure of a warm bed is often hard to resist. In addition, there is the uncertainty around the current COVID 19 situation.

As I write this newsletter we are fortunate that there are very low cases in the Latrobe Valley and the greater region of Gippsland.

The Premier has recommended for people in regional areas to wear a mask if they are unable to socially distance in public areas such as on a bus, train, tram, taxi and the like. The advice around schools has not changed at this stage. Students are not required to socially distance in school but I do ask that they remain 1.5 metres from adults where possible. Wearing a mask is not a requirement however staff and students are welcome to do so. We ask students to not touch their mask if they are wearing one and to regularly sanitise their hands.

The advice on washing hands, coughing and sneezing into your elbow, not sharing equipment or food and using hand sanitiser continues to be a priority at our school. The enhanced cleaning regime will also continue through Term 3.

Assessment Weeks

Our Common Assessment Tasks are used to gauge student achievement against the Victorian Curriculum standards. They are the final or summative assessment for a unit of work in any given subject. All Common Assessment Tasks (CATs) will be completed during weeks 8 and 9 of this term. There will be minimal disruption to classes during this time and I ask that student absences are also kept to a minimum. Students who miss CATs will need to make up the time to complete them. This might include attending our after-school homework club on a Wednesday evening. If your child is absent please inform the Team Leader so that arrangements can be made.


Message from our Principal continues......


*50 Year 7 students have signed up to visit Gippsland Tech School.
