Message from our Principal continues.....

Year 10 Students Completing a VCE Sequence 2019

For many years, most Year 10 students have completed Units 1 and 2 of a VCE or VCAL (Year 11) subject, however, not all students have reached the level of maturity or skill needed to be successful.

From 2019, students will need to apply and be accepted into a VCE sequence. No student will be disadvantaged, as they will get to select from the full range of offerings in 2020.

Students not completing a Year 11 subject in 2019 will select from a range of classes which will ensure academic rigour and development of skills to prepare students for 2020.

Year 9 and 10 Elective for 2019

Last week I spoke to all our current Year 8 and 9 students about students having input into the electives we will offer next year. Along with teacher expertise and availability, I want student voice to help drive our subject offerings. Students will select their electives in the coming weeks.

Mobile Phone Use

The dilemma of whether mobile phones are a distraction in class has been and will continue to be an issue facing all schools. As a Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) school, Kurnai College encourages students to have their laptops and tablets ready to use as a point of learning tool or for classwork as set out by the teacher. It is our responsibility as a community, to support young people to use devices appropriately in different settings, including school. Churchill Campus now has a phone holder in every classroom where students are asked to park their phones at the beginning of the lesson so as not to distract them from classroom learning. Students will be able to access their phones only if their teacher deems that the phone at that point in the class would assist the learning.



Homework Club

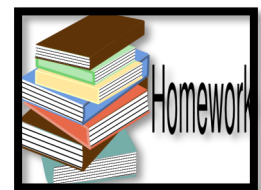
We've had a great turn out for our Homework Club on Wednesday nights. Students can get extra help with classwork, in a relaxing environment.

Year 7 News

Welcome back to a much sunnier and warmer Term 4. We hope all students and their families enjoyed a relaxing and fun-filled break over the holidays.

This term students continue their work in both their core and elective subject areas. We hope all students progress with the same enthusiasm and keenness towards their work as shown in the previous three terms. With Celebration Day, Headstart and student activities week all taking place towards the end of this term, there are many events to look forward to.

Warmer Weather

With the warmer weather having already begun, we would like to remind students of the uniform policy. Girls can wear their summer dress or navy shorts with their maroon polo shirt and boys can wear navy shorts and maroon polo shirt. All students are required to wear black shoes and white socks, with the exception of Physical Education classes where students are to wear runners as well as their navy PE polo shirt. Students may wear hats during recess, lunch and outdoor activities, but will need to remove them during class time.

Students are also reminded that spray deodorant is not allowed at school and it will be confiscated if found. Students can bring roll on deodorant to use if they choose to.

It is highly recommended students bring a bottle of water to school as the temperature continues to increase as it can be taken into class with them. It is often found that students suffer from headaches and fatigue due to dehydration which can be prevented with a constant intake of water throughout the day.

Swimming

This term the girls will partake in swimming lessons at the Churchill Leisure Centre each Monday. This is a fantastic opportunity that the boys were able to take advantage of last term. Please ensure students participating bring their required swimming gear as well as a towel and goggles if needed. If students are unable to participate, we ask a signed note addressed to their Physical Education teacher be sent excusing them from the session.



Health

This term students will be discussing puberty and the changes they may encounter during adolescence. These lessons will be conducted during Health sessions. It is encouraged that families take this opportunity to continue any discussions at home, particularly if students are raising any questions they might feel uncomfortable asking during class time.

Year 8 News

Welcome back to the last term for all students in Year 8. A reminder to parents about the importance of contacting the Attendance Hotline, 5132 3711, if your child is absent from school. By letting the Attendance Officer, Zoe Plumb, know about student absences this saves the need for text messages to be sent out or absent letters being sent home. Please assist us in maintaining accurate attendance records for your child.

Mobile Phones

Students are now required to place their mobile phones in the phone holders which are located in all classrooms. If your child brings their phone into the classroom and does not place this in the phone holder the phone will be taken by the teacher and returned at the end of the school day. A mobile phone is not to be used instead of a laptop or calculator.

Uniform Expectations

If students arrive at school, out of uniform, without a note, they will be required to change into school supplied uniform for the day. If your child is out of uniform, please provide a signed note, which explains why your child is not wearing uniform on a particular day. When students are at school or participating in school activities that take them out of the school grounds they are expected to be in full uniform. This does not include non-school uniform jackets, beanies, hoodies or tracksuit pants, however they can wear long sleeve navy or white tops (without hoods) underneath their polo tops. Students are also reminded that they are required to wear shoes that are predominately black. If you require any assistance with school uniform, please don't hesitate to contact the school and speak to either a member of the Year 8 Team or the Wellbeing Team members.

Student Laptops

A reminder that students are expected to have a laptop and that students need to bring their laptop to all classes. Staff in the Year 8 team have worked to determine which students have their own laptop or required access to a school laptop in the short term. Therefore, all students in Year 8 currently have access to a laptop. If parents and guardians could support the school by checking that their child is taking their laptop to school that would assist with trying to develop good organisational habits.

Tech School – Design: Flat Pack Furniture Challenge

Twenty four eager and excited Year 8 students attended a two day program at the Tech School in Morwell where they were in charge of designing a flat pack piece of furniture. The students were required to use their maths skills to design a piece of furniture within the requirements, which were provided by the customer, during an interview between the designers and the customer. The students were then required to use CAD software to design their product before manufacturing the piece of furniture using the laser cutting machine. The students were then required to design a campaign to market and sell their product focusing on using persuasive skills and new technologies to improve their marketing.

Victorian Young Leaders to China 2018

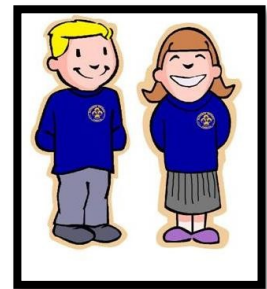
For those Year 8 students who are currently studying Chinese and planning on continuing into Year 9, the opportunity to participate in the Victorian Young Leaders to China in 2019 tour is currently looking for Expressions of Interest. For the past four years students from Kurnai College have participated in the VYLC Program. This is a program organised by the Department of Education and Training (DET) which allows students from a number of schools to spend six weeks in China studying Chinese language, experiencing Chinese culture and lifestyle and developing their personal leadership skills.

While the exact dates have not yet been confirmed, the tentative dates are Saturday, 16th March to Friday, 26th April, 2019. This time includes the two weeks of term 1 holidays. There is also a two pre-departure camp in Melbourne in February that all students are required to attend.

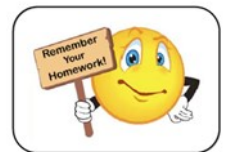

Year 9 News

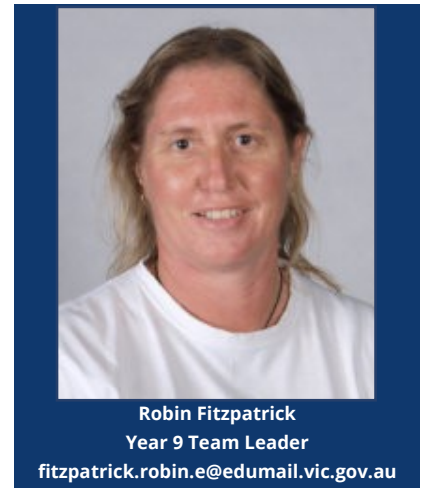
We were pleased to see all our students back after the holidays somewhat refreshed for our last term.

Students are expected to be in appropriate uniform every day. Black pants and non-college hoodies should not be worn to school. Students wearing inappropriate uniform will be asked to change.

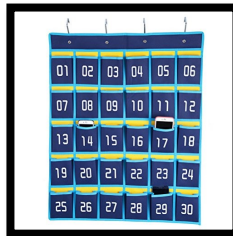


Mobile Phones

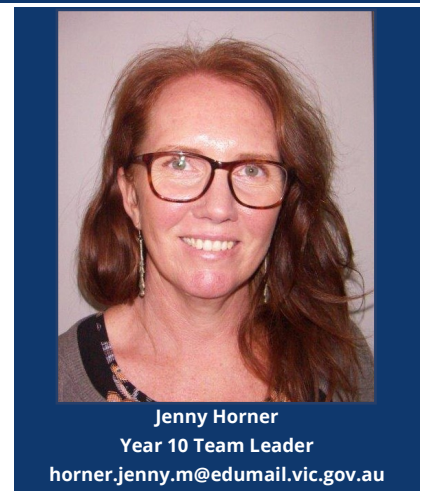

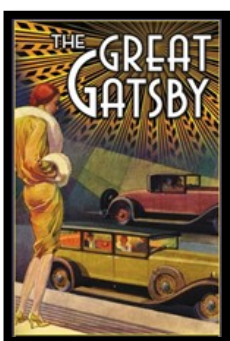

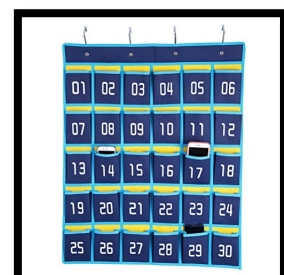

Would you like to attend the Mt Hotham Camp in 2019?

Mt Hotham is a well-known ski resort approximately 4-5 hours drive from Churchill via Omeo. The main activities undertaken on the camp will be downhill skiing and/or snowboarding.

The camp will run from Sunday 7th July to Friday 12th July, 2019. Students must be at the University Campus bus stop at 10.00am on the Sunday. We intend to return to Kurnai College (University Campus) at approximately 9.00pm on the Friday. Students will be staying at a Ski Lodge located at the top of the mountain. The total cost of the camp will be **approximately** \$1650.00 which includes:

- Resort entries
- Accommodation
- All meals
- Lift
- Lessons
- Night skiing on Wednesday evening
- Ski/Snowboard Hire including carve skis, boots and poles or board and boots
- Transport to and from Mount Hotham
- Hotham hoodie jumper

Students will need to pay a deposit of \$300 if they would like to secure a position for the camp by 1/12/2018. We have organised a payment plan in an effort to give families the opportunity to finalise the full payment by 2.00pm on Friday 21st July 2019. While we understand this is an expensive camp we strongly believe that this is the most economical way of giving students the opportunity to participate in Alpine Snow sports. All students who participate in this camp will come home exhausted and thoroughly satisfied with their experiences, bubbling with stories of the thrills and spills they encountered.

In order for this camp to proceed, we require a minimum of 20 students to attend and will cap the attendance at 25 students. In the event of us not receiving enough interest, we will have to cancel this camp and, in this instance only, your deposit will be refunded.

Students are expected to have a good behaviour history and an average or above average fitness level. Parents will be notified if their child is in danger of losing their invitation to camp due to poor behaviour at school. These decisions will be made by the Principal, in consultation with the advocate team and Camp Coordinator.

Additional information will be provided to your child as time gets closer to ensure your child is properly equipped for the camp. Their safety and comfort will depend on this. If students don't have the required equipment they may be able to borrow a snow jacket and pants or alternatively this clothing can be hired from Mt Hotham.

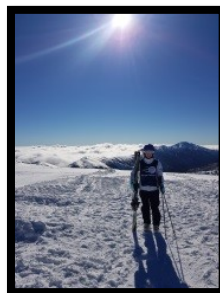
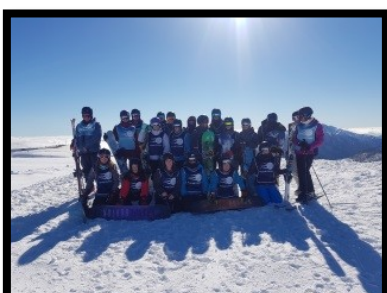
