Student Absences

Over the past week new absence letters have been sent out to parents of Year 8 students who have unexplained absences from school. It is DEECD (Department of Education and Early Childhood Development) policy that all student absences are accounted for and therefore we do require explanations for all absences from school. Please make sure that you do let the school know, by contacting the school prior to 9am, where possible, if it is expected that your child will be away from school. You may leave a voice message on the absence voice mail, which can be accessed 24hours a day. Starting in Week 2 of Term 4 these absence letters will be posted out every fortnight.

Equipment

Uniform Expectations

This does not include non-school uniform jackets, beanies, hoodies or tracksuit pants, however they can wear long sleeve navy or white tops (without hoods) underneath their polo tops. Students are also reminded that they are required to wear shoes that are predominately black. If your child is out of uniform, please provide a note which explains why your child is not wearing uniform on a particular day. If you require any assistance with school uniform, please don't hesitate to contact the school and speak to either a member of the Year 8 Team or the Wellbeing Team.

The language is rough, the acting is wild, and the climax is powerful.


Mobile Phones

Even though terms three and four are predominantly performance and assessment terms, we are also preparing for next year by seeking new enrolments.

Latrobe Valley Eisteddfod

A number of our College and VCE ensembles performed in the eisteddfod in a variety of sections.

The College vocal group participated in the Primary/Secondary Schools Vocal Group section and received an Honourable Mention.

The College Guitar Ensemble and Mixed Concert Band both performed in the Secondary Schools Instrument Ensemble section, where Mixed Concert Band received a third placing and the Guitar Ensemble was nominated as the winner in this section – as part of the first place prize a shield was presented to winners which features the names of all the schools that have won this shield. This is also the second time that the College Guitar Ensemble have won this shield for the school.






