### Uniform

With the absence of Form Group occurring four days a week, we have noticed students lapsing in maintaining correct uniform. Students are required to wear ONLY school uniform items and will be asked to remove any items of clothing that is not school uniform. Understandably being Winter, we want to ensure students are warm enough outside and in classrooms. However, hoody's underneath uniforms will asked to be removed. We strongly recommend students ensure their names are clearly written on all of their uniform tags, including their maroon and PE polo's as they are regularly changing these throughout the week. If there are any concerns with students' uniform, please contact the school so we can find a solution.

Kurnai's uniform policy is as follows:

Students are to wear the maroon college polo with navy shorts or trousers with girls having the option to wear the school dress. There is a choice of the school hoodie, spray jacket or fleece jacket. Shoes must be predominately black and covered in with white socks.

The PE uniform consists of the navy college polo with navy shorts or track pants and runners.

#### **Mobile Phones**

The Campus has placed a strict policy on the use of mobile phones in the classroom due to the increasing distraction they pose for students and their learning. Each classroom is equipped with a mobile phone pouch where students can place their phones at the beginning of each lesson. At the end of each lesson, students are able to retrieve their phones for use outside of lesson times. Alternatively, students can keep their phones in their lockers during class time where they are secured by an individual coded lock. It has been acknowledged that students in Year 7 are doing a great job at following this new policy and we thank them and ask them to continue their efforts. # Year 8 News .....

It is concerning to notice that over the past two weeks that there has been an increase in the number of Year 8 students who are arriving late to class. It is so important that students arrive to class on time. Through a number of classroom observations, when students arrive late to class they stop the teacher from teaching and in effect stop the learning time available for the rest of the class. In this instance all students need to respect the right of a teacher to teach and the students to learn.

Lack of appropriate equipment in class is the other concern that has been noticed in the Year 8 classes. Students, in some instance, arrive to class and then leave to collect equipment such as pens or exercise books during the instructional phase of the lesson.

The importance of coming to class on time with the appropriate equipment is something that all parents and guardians can support the school and teachers, by ensuring that their child has the appropriate equipment and understands the importance of being on time.

### Careers Week

On Tuesday 21st August, most of the Year 8 students participated in industry visits as part of Careers Week. The students visited the LV Express Printers and Earthworks Energy Manufacturing. This excursion was provided to all students at no cost and lunch was also provided. Fifty four students participated in this excursion.

At Earthworks, Catherine and Ben introduced students to the concept of a cooperative and explained that their cooperative has been established based on the philosophy of trading with sustainable and ethical products. Soft skills such as resilience, team work and problem solving were also discussed as the type of skills that are necessary for students who would like to work in a cooperative. The students also learnt about the manufacturing of the solar hot water systems and electricity.

After lunch at Immigration Park the students then visited LV Printers. Peter explained to the students the process for printing a newspaper. The students learnt that LV Printers print thirty two different newspapers for places such as Phillip Island, Maffra, Sale, Yarram, Castlemaine as well as the Latrobe Valley. Peter also explained the type of qualifications that students would need to have if they wanted to work as a printer.

### Mobile Phones

### WE WANT OUR PARENTS TO TELL US WHAT THEY THINK!

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents think of our school. The Parent Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education and Training that is conducted amongst a sample of randomly selected parents. It is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of parents' perceptions of school climate, student behaviours and student engagement. Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies.

Approximately 30 per cent of parents will be invited to participate in this year's survey. Parents will be chosen randomly and will be mailed further details if selected. All responses to the survey are anonymous. This year the Parent Opinion Survey will be conducted from Monday 23rd July to Sunday 26th August.

The survey will be conducted online, only takes 10-15 minutes to complete, and can be accessed at any convenient time within the fieldwork period on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones. The online survey will be available in a range of languages other than English. These include: Arabic, Vietnamese, Mandarin, Chin (haka), Hindi, Japanese, Somali, Turkish, Punjabi and Greek.

The survey results will be reported back to the school at the end of September.



The Secondary School Vaccine Program offers free vaccines to Year 7 and 10 students. These vaccines provide protection against:

Diphtheria, tetanus and pertussis (whooping cough) – one dose for year 7 students

Human Papillomavirus (HPV) - two doses for year 7 students

Meningococcal A,C,W,Y - one dose for year 10 students

Parents/guardians of year 7 and 10 students should look out for the vaccine consent card booklet coming home from school with your child. You need to read the information, complete and return the card regardless of whether your child is being vaccinated at school.

The Latrobe City immunisation service may contact you about the Secondary School Vaccine Program. Schools are authorised to provide basic parent/guardian contact details to local councils for this purpose. Contact the school by 28 February 2018 if you do not want your contact details given to the Latrobe City immunisation service.

To learn more about the Secondary School Vaccine Program, the vaccines, the diseases they protect against, or how you can prepare your child for vaccination, go to betterhealth.vic.gov.au

Additionally, the Commonwealth government is funding vaccinations for all children under 20 years who missed scheduled vaccines. If students have missed vaccines, either in childhood or adolescence, and require catch-up vaccines, they should speak with their immunisation provider. (ie. local council or GP).
