Augmented Reality

Over the last five weeks a group of students from Years 8, 9 and 10 have been involved in an Augmented Reality Program held at the Gippsland Tech School in Morwell. Students learnt new digital skills and how to apply them to a real project. The program required students to build an augmented experience for a corporate client. This involves similar skills to computer game development and whilst it was challenging work it allowed students to demonstrate patience and perseverance which are skills necessary throughout life. Last Tuesday, all students presented their work to the Augmented Reality cohort. Congratulations to all students who participated.

For the last 5 weeks on every Tuesday some students from Kurnai College participated in the Augmented Reality at the Gippsland Tech School. Through the weeks we learnt how to make games and do new things on the computers. The first 3 weeks we had help with the teachers there and after they told us everything we needed to know we were on our own to make markers. By creating the markers, we had to hold a phone over it and if we had information or videos we could put them on the screen, we added different videos and objects to the markers so when the phones were held over the markers the information would show up. Our results showed overall growth in Numeracy and Reading. We will continue to analyse the data and use the information to inform future programs and strategies to be implemented in classrooms.

Equipment




