Learning Behaviour Updates

The recent Learning Behaviour Updates are now available on Compass. I encourage you to go through the update with your child to highlight learning behaviours they need to improve in order to meet their potential. Whilst the Learning Behaviour Updates are not an indication of achievement levels, they indicate which students have the necessary attitude to their studies in order to be successful. I would like every student to strive for a Performance Average of 3.5/4.0!

Assessment Weeks

Our Common Assessment Tasks are used to gauge student achievement against the Victorian Curriculum standards. They are the final or summative assessment for a unit of work in any given subject. All Common Assessment Tasks (CATS) will be completed during weeks 8 and 9 of this term. There will be minimal disruption to classes during this time and I ask that student absences are kept to a minimum. Students who miss CATS will need to make up the time in our after school homework club on a Wednesday evening. If your child is absent please inform the Team Leader so that arrangements can be made.

Program for International Student Assessment (PISA)

Every three years PISA collects information about students and schools to monitor differences in educational outcomes over time. This year will be the seventh PISA study and is conducted in more than 80 participating countries. Undertaking PISA is important because the results indicate how well-prepared students in Australia are for learning once they leave school and it identifies areas for improvement over time by schools, education systems and governments. Kurnai College, Churchill Campus will once again be participating in the PISA study this year. Students are randomly selected and will be notified via mail. If your child is selected it is important that they attend the allocated testing day, Thursday 23rd August.

Our school is participating in ROAD SMART, a new road safety education and training program designed for Year 10 students. Road Smart involves a:


- classroom session delivered by VicRoads on Monday 20th August, and

Short period Homestay families required

Kurnai College will be hosting two short term Chinese Study tours during term 3 this year as part of our International Program. We are looking for families who would be interested in hosting a Chinese student/s for up to a week.

While at Kurnai, the students will participate in a mix of English Language classes located at the University Campus and immersion classes at the Junior Campuses. These classes will be followed up by organised afternoon activities within the local area.

The Homestay is to provide a welcoming, nurturing and safe environment for young students, as it will likely be the first time these students have been out of China. If possible, it may pay to consider having two students billeted with your family making it less daunting and easier for both you and the students.

Hosting an international student is very rewarding and offers a wonderful opportunity to learn about a new culture and share our Australian way of life. This would be a great opportunity to consider for our students who are currently studying Mandarin or have/will be participating in our trips to China.

Host families are paid a nominal fee of \$30.00 per night per student, which is to assist with food, accommodation and transportation as required for students that are living with them.

WE WANT OUR PARENTS TO TELL US WHAT THEY THINK!

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents think of our school. The Parent Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education and Training that is conducted amongst a sample of randomly selected parents. It is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of parents' perceptions of school climate, student behaviours and student engagement. Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies.

Approximately 30 per cent of parents will be invited to participate in this year's survey. Parents will be chosen randomly and will be mailed further details if selected. All responses to the survey are anonymous. This year the Parent Opinion Survey will be conducted from Monday 23rd July to Sunday 26th August.

The survey will be conducted online, only takes 10-15 minutes to complete, and can be accessed at any convenient time within the fieldwork period on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones. The online survey will be available in a range of languages other than English. These include: Arabic, Vietnamese, Mandarin, Chin (haka), Hindi, Japanese, Somali, Turkish, Punjabi and Greek.

The survey results will be reported back to the school at the end of September.



Secondary School vaccinations in 2018

The Secondary School Vaccine Program offers free vaccines to Year 7 and 10 students. These vaccines provide protection against:

Diphtheria, tetanus and pertussis (whooping cough) – one dose for year 7 students

Human Papillomavirus (HPV) – two doses for year 7 students

Meningococcal A,C,W,Y – one dose for year 10 students

Parents/guardians of year 7 and 10 students should look out for the vaccine consent card booklet coming home from school with your child. You need to read the information, complete and return the card regardless of whether your child is being vaccinated at school.

The Latrobe City immunisation service may contact you about the Secondary School Vaccine Program. Schools are authorised to provide basic parent/guardian contact details to local councils for this purpose. Contact the school by 28 February 2018 if you do not want your contact details given to the Latrobe City immunisation service.

To learn more about the Secondary School Vaccine Program, the vaccines, the diseases they protect against, or how you can prepare your child for vaccination, go to betterhealth.vic.gov.au

Additionally, the Commonwealth government is funding vaccinations for all children under 20 years who missed scheduled vaccines. If students have missed vaccines, either in child-hood or adolescence, and require catch-up vaccines, they should speak with their immunisation provider. (ie. local council or GP).

- 2. Obtain a quotation for the device you have selected.
- 3. Hand the Centrelink Deduction Form and quotation to the Campus General Office.
- 4. Kurnai College will endeavor to purchase these items on your behalf as soon as possible.
- Once the device has arrived at the school you will be contacted to collect the device from the school.
- 6. We will require your signature at this time as proof of pick up.
- 7. The charge for the device will be put on your Family Account at the College.
- 8. Your fortnightly Centrelink payments will be allocated to this charge on your Family Account.
