Examinations

This week our Year 10 students are undertaking their Semester exams in English, Mathematics and for their VCE subject. Exams provide a great opportunity for students to demonstrate their skills, knowledge and understanding of the subject they have studied. It also provides students and teachers a measure of how well the skills have been mastered and what needs more work, it helps students take responsibility for learning for the long term rather than for one period of day and it prepares students for future assessments such as aptitude tests for apprenticeships and traineeships, entrance exams for university degrees and VCE and VCAL assessments.

Homework Club

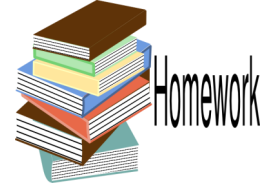

Year 7 News

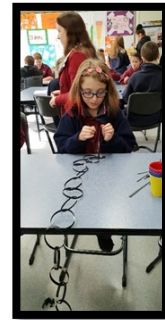

Uniform

With the cooler weather occurring, we are noticing students are wearing non-uniform items. We strongly recommend students ensure their names are clearly written on all of their uniform tags, including their maroon and PE polo as they are regularly changing these throughout the week.

Kurnai's uniform policy is as follows:

Students are to wear the maroon college polo with navy shorts or trousers with girls having the option to wear the college dress. There is a choice of the college jumper, knitted jumper, spray jacket or fleece jacket. Shoes must be predominately black and covered in with white socks.

The PE uniform consists of the navy college polo with navy shorts or track pants and runners.

Uniform Expectations

With the colder weather, students are still expected to be in full uniform. This does not include non-school uniform jackets, hoodies or tracksuit pants, however they can wear long sleeve navy or white tops (without hoods) underneath their polo tops. Students are also reminded that they are required to wear shoes that are predominately black. Form Group

Form Group starts at 8.30am. There are still a small number of students who continually arrive late to this class and it has an impact on the learning of the other students. When students arrive late to this class Year 8 staff members are asking the students to sit at the front of the library so that they don't disturb the other Year 8 students who are working. It is important that students arrive in time to participate in the Form Group session. It is during this time that Year 8 students undertake silent reading and activities associated with developing their comprehension skills, based on the book that they are reading. This is also a time when announcements from classroom teachers are made to assist the students with planning their day.

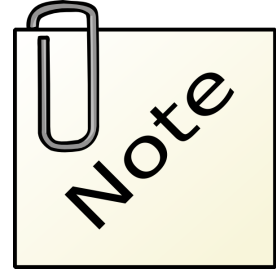

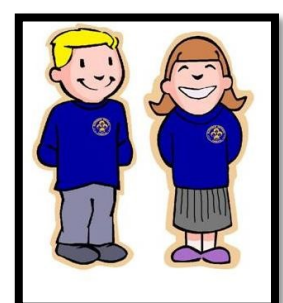

TRANSITION FOR YEAR 10 STUDENTS INTO YEAR 11 2019

- Year 11 & Year 12 Information Evening

It was good to see a number of students and their families at the VCE and VCAL Information Evening on Wednesday night. The expectations are high for ALL students who venture to the University Campus in 2019 - whether you choose a VCE or VCAL pathway. VCE students are expected to undertake 2-3 hours of home study every night in Year 11 and attendance to VCAL classes is set at no less than 100%! Collaboration between students through deliberating and sharing ideas, providing feedback and support to their peers is also expected. Entry into either pathway is not guaranteed unless you have the right work ethic and attitude that ensures you will succeed!

- Subject Information Day and Course Counselling

On Wednesday 13th June, ALL Year 10 students will attend the senior campus to meet with staff to continue their course selection process. Students will have the opportunity to discuss their subject selections and gain an idea of what subjects and possible pathways they are interested in for their studies in 2019.

Year 9 / Year 10 China Trip

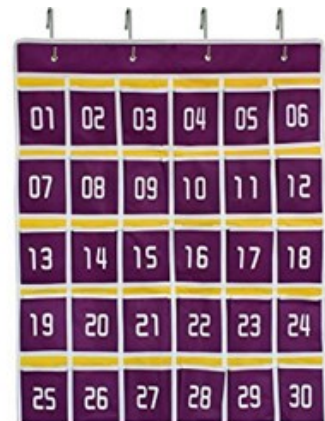

BYOD (Bring your own device)

Short period Homestay families required

Kurnai College will be hosting two short term Chinese Study tours during term 3 this year as part of our International Program. We are looking for families who would be interested in hosting a Chinese student/s for up to a week.

While at Kurnai, the students will participate in a mix of English Language classes located at the University Campus and immersion classes at the Junior Campuses. These classes will be followed up by organised afternoon activities within the local area.

The Homestay is to provide a welcoming, nurturing and safe environment for young students, as it will likely be the first time these students have been out of China. If possible, it may pay to consider having two students billeted with your family making it less daunting and easier for both you and the students.

Hosting an international student is very rewarding and offers a wonderful opportunity to learn about a new culture and share our Australian way of life. This would be a great opportunity to consider for our students who are currently studying Mandarin or have/will be participating in our trips to China.

Host families are paid a nominal fee of \$30.00 per night per student, which is to assist with food, accommodation and transportation as required for students that are living with them.

- 31st July – 6th August Students from Yiting & Heyetang Middle School from Hang Zhou (Yrs. 7 & 8)
- 6th August – 9th August Students from Xinhe Middle School from Hang Zhou (Yrs. 10 & 11)

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Secondary School vaccinations in 2018

The Secondary School Vaccine Program offers free vaccines to Year 7 and 10 students. These vaccines provide protection against:

Diphtheria, tetanus and pertussis (whooping cough) – one dose for year 7 students

Human Papillomavirus (HPV) – two doses for year 7 students

Meningococcal A,C,W,Y – one dose for year 10 students

Parents/guardians of year 7 and 10 students should look out for the vaccine consent card booklet coming home from school with your child. You need to read the information, complete and return the card regardless of whether your child is being vaccinated at school.

The Latrobe City immunisation service may contact you about the Secondary School Vaccine Program. Schools are authorised to provide basic parent/guardian contact details to local councils for this purpose. Contact the school by 28 February 2018 if you do not want your contact details given to the Latrobe City immunisation service.

To learn more about the Secondary School Vaccine Program, the vaccines, the diseases they protect against, or how you can prepare your child for vaccination, go to betterhealth.vic.gov.au

Additionally, the Commonwealth government is funding vaccinations for all children under 20 years who missed scheduled vaccines. If students have missed vaccines, either in childhood or adolescence, and require catch-up vaccines, they should speak with their immunisation provider. (ie. local council or GP).

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Calling for feedback on the Youth Space Latrobe design principles

The Youth Space Latrobe project has been underway over the past few months. Young people have discussed what it is like to live in the Valley, what issues are important and what they think is needed in the Valley to help them thrive.

Led by our Youth Core Design Team, young people came together in February 2018 to workshop what activities and services a new youth space could provide, where the youth space should be located, and explore design concepts. **Some of the students at your school were involved in this process.**

These workshops led to the creation of **nine design principles** that will inform the creation of a new Youth Space Latrobe.

The Youth Core Design Team would love to know the community's thoughts on these principles. A short, de-identified survey has been created to describe and evaluate the design principles.

We are seeking your feedback and your support in getting this survey out to your school community.

Once the design principles have been refined, they will be presented to the Victorian Government for consideration.
