The goal of the tournament was to encourage communication between students of different social groups, and to potentially increase the popularity of board/strategy games.

library, often with a small crowd of interested onlookers. While chess will never have as large a following as most ball sports, it is refreshing to see that many students know (some of) the rules, and that this tournament provides an opportunity for people to demonstrate an area of expertise that may not have other outlets. Following the tournament, it is hoped that more students will develop an interest in chess, and lunchtime sessions may be organised to teach the rules

of the game, as well as some strategic motifs.

Redevelopment Update

Representatives from our Morwell Campus recently met with the newly appointed supervising architect for Stage 2 of the Rebuild Project.

Although this project will not commence until early 2020, we are keen to begin preparations as soon as possible.

Stage 2 includes a new library facility that will contain all the current features, as well as a community room and classroom space that can be separated from the remainder of the building by an operable wall. This space will be available for community organisations to hire, and will incorporate a kitchenette and separate toilets making it ideal for meetings and other gatherings.

Also included in this stage is the administration wing. This will house Campus and College office personnel, as well as College well-being staff, together with The Smith Family.

"The Talk" was an entertaining and interactive presentation which educated students regarding sexual safety and healthy relationships.

The week ended with a healthy lunch and a colour fun run. Staff and students had a great time and are looking forward to the next one!



Meanwhile, Stage 1 is well on track, with the handover of parts of this stage anticipated to be in December, with the remainder handed over in January ready for the 2019 school year.

Demolition of the current science rooms and F-Block will also commence in January, with all asbestos being removed prior to students and staff returning for the academic year.
