#### Uniform

We have been very happy with the way Year 7's have maintained their uniform in the first few weeks of the year. With the mornings starting to become cooler, we have noticed students beginning their day with a jumper/jacket and ending their day without one. We strongly recommend students ensure their names are clearly written on all of their uniform tags, including their school and PE polo's as they are regularly changing these throughout the week.

Kurnai's uniform policy is as follows:

Students are to wear the maroon college polo with navy shorts or trousers with girls having the option to wear the college dress. There is a choice of the spray jacket or fleece jacket. Shoes must be predominately black and covered in, with white socks.

The PE uniform consists of the navy college polo with navy shorts or track pants and runners.

### Learning Behaviour Updates

Learning Behaviour Updates are completed every four weeks and are an assessment of students learning behaviours in the classroom. This is a chance for teachers to provide feedback on how well students operate during lessons including their abilities to work with others, be prepared, task completion and participation. These reports provide a grade point average which is evidence students can use to set goals and aim for improvement.



#### Phones at School

Students are welcome to bring their phones to school but are strongly advised to keep them in a safe place such as their secured lockers. If students choose to keep their phones on them, it is up to teacher discretion on when and how they are used during lessons. As phones are not considered devices, teachers may confiscate students' phones until the end of the lesson or day. During time outside of the classroom, we encourage students to use their phones in a safe and responsible manner, including being aware of cyber safety and others who may be impacted by usage such things as being in the background of photos.

The Year 8 students have been settling in well with students actively participating in school activities, such as swimming. This week the teachers have been writing the Learning Behaviour Progress reports which will be available, electronically, to parents this week.

If students have homework or catch up work to do it is a good opportunity to access extra teacher support and school resources.



### Silent Reading

During Silent Reading the Year 8 students, on the whole, are completing their Reading Journals, reading quietly and are engaging with their books. At the completion of each reading session, the students are either given an activity to complete or may select an activity from a list that has been complied by teachers and is located in their Reading Journal.

We ask that parents and guardians talk to their children about the books they are reading and encourage twenty minutes of silent reading at home.

Once they had successfully created an electric current, they were challenged to work cooperatively as a whole class to connect their food batteries in series and see if they could light up an LED using only lemons and tomatoes as the power source.

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF)

The Camps, Sports and Excursion Fund provides payments for eligible students to attend activities like:

- school camps or trips
- swimming and school-organised sport programs
- outdoor education programs
- excursions and incursions.

Families holding a valid means-tested concession card or temporary foster parents are eligible to apply.

Payments are: \$225 per year for eligible secondary school students.

Payments are made directly to the school and are tied to the student. Most payments start from March onwards.

### Positive Behaviour Support (PBS)

#### Core Classes

In core classes students are progressing with their skills and content development. In English, students are analysing persuasive texts, in order to examine how authors manipulate their audiences. 
### Full steam ahead!

### Year 10 Team Building Day (Mirboo North Pool)

Our Year 10 Team Building Day was a relaxing and enjoyable day where students participated in a range of activities with the aim of building a sense of team between the Churchill and Morwell Campus staff and students

Caine Conte said that "during the day the life guards brought out an inflatable obstacle course. It was hard to complete because of how slippery it was. It was fun to be able to talk to everyone outside of the school ... and if there was another day like this I would gladly go again!"





### Youth Space Latrobe Project

Justin Coleman represented our Year 10 students at the Youth Space Latrobe Project Prototyping Workshop. Justin said:

"The aim of the day was to help plan, a potential youth space for people aged 12 to 25. We had to plan out designs, do small replicas of our designs and pitch these ideas to everyone else who was there, and also others who were from companies in the areas. We also looked at the areas in the Latrobe Valley, and proposed where the space could be, and whether it would be across two sites or only one individual place. We had to keep in mind that all people would use this space and it had to accommodate for all lifestyles and tastes whether it be sport, or gaming or any other hobby youth enjoy doing. We had to also make it suitable for coming generations who too, may use this space. We looked at all aspects, such as transport, activities, accessibility, which are all a common area for youth. This workshop presented a unique opportunity for students to develop leadership skills, experience co-design and work closely with government and other stakeholder in the design of a space or spaces in Latrobe to meet the needs of Young People."

### Royal Women's Hospital event "Meet a Scientist" for 2018

Three of our Year 10 Churchill girls (Shelby Love, Sophie Scholes and Milly Bolton) celebrated the International Day of Women and Girls in Science, at Government House last Friday. The girls were able to meet and hear from four of the Royal Women's Hospital top young women researchers as they shared their story of how they became a scientist and now make ground breaking discoveries to improve the health and wellbeing of women and babies. The experience provided the students with an understanding of how a career in science can be applied in a hospital setting to make a dramatic difference to people's lives.

### Secondary School vaccinations in 2018

The Secondary School Vaccine Program offers free vaccines to Year 7 and 10 students. These vaccines provide protection against:

Diphtheria, tetanus and pertussis (whooping cough) – one dose for year 7 students

Human Papillomavirus (HPV) – two doses for year 7 students

Meningococcal A,C,W,Y - one dose for year 10 students

Parents/guardians of year 7 and 10 students should look out for the vaccine consent card booklet coming home from school with your child. You need to read the information, complete and return the card regardless of whether your child is being vaccinated at school.

The Latrobe City immunisation service may contact you about the Secondary School Vaccine Program. Schools are authorised to provide basic parent/guardian contact details to local councils for this purpose. Contact the school by 28 February 2018 if you do not want your contact details given to the Latrobe City immunisation service.

To learn more about the Secondary School Vaccine Program, the vaccines, the diseases they protect against, or how you can prepare your child for vaccination, go to betterhealth.vic.gov.au

Additionally, the Commonwealth government is funding vaccinations for all children under 20 years who missed scheduled vaccines. If students have missed vaccines, either in childhood or adolescence, and require catch-up vaccines, they should speak with their immunisation provider. (ie. local council or GP).
