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Message from our Campus Principal



Again, more information as we approach the pointy end of the year (and secondary schooling) for our year 12 students. Year 12 VCE VM students will be having exit interviews, with their parents, on Tuesday 5th, and Wednesday 6th of September from 1:30 pm until late. These interviews are critical to ensure that these Year 12 students have a clear pathway they will follow in 2024 or, importantly, they are identified as needing more support to get this pathway in place. The involvement of

parents/guardians in these interviews is critical so that this information does not just sit with the school and the student. Please make sure that your student has booked a time for the interview when you can attend.

The non-ATAR process for Year 12 VCE students has begun. The number of students who have expressed an interest in going non-ATAR is smaller this year, which is fine as this decision is purely for the students and their parents/guardians. Parents/guardians and students will be asked to sign the initial non-ATAR information sheet and then parents will be contacted by the school to ensure they understand all the aspects of

this decision. Non-ATAR students will be involved in information sessions with TAFE and the mock job interviews happening early in term 4.

Year 12 VCE students sitting for their ATAR score will be involved in the English practice exam on the last Friday of this term. During the term holidays, there are more practice exams and a wide range of revision lectures both online and in person at the lecture theatres in Fed Uni. The information about this has been sent out through Teams or students can get a hard copy from Study Hall. AND make sure you read the section in this newsletter on the VTAC process and timeline to apply for university courses in 2024.

This is a very busy and stressful time for students and staff. If you have concerns about your student please contact the school and let us know.

Students can be very good at hiding any problems they might be experiencing but there are always things we can do to help students if we know. Call



The VTAC Application Process - An Overview



VTAC OPEN NOW - START Applying!

Just a reminder that the VTAC timely application period is open **NOW** until the **28th September 2023,** where you will pay a one-off fee of **\$55.** If after this date you are looking at undertaking University courses or certain TAFE courses, this fee will become **\$140 - very late applications it increases to \$180.**

SEAS – All domestic students on this campus are ELIGIBLE to apply for SEAS category 1 and potentially category 4 due to covid. Please make sure you get this done, as it could be the difference in getting an offer. SEAS will close on the **6th October 2023**.

Scholarships – <u>All</u> students are encouraged to apply for Scholarships which close on the **6th October 2023**.

Please come in to careers, if you need a hand with this process.

ACCOMMODATION

If you have to move away to study, you will need to consider accommodation options. If you would like to live on-campus, you will need to start considering your options now as some universities are 'first in, first served'. **Residential Applications will open soon so have a look at the University you are wanting to attend and be ready to apply!**

YEAR 12 SUBJECT SELECTION 2024

VCE students will be advising careers of their Year 12 subject selections for 2024 during their English class. The majority of Year 11 VCE students are studying six subjects and in Year 12 they will study five subjects. This means that students will need to reduce the subjects they study in Year 12.

So that students are prepared for this day, we encourage they:

- * Speak with teachers if you have any concerns or questions in regard to continuing on with any subjects in year 12.
- * Discuss thoughts and ideas with your parents and guardians. Speak with careers if you have any questions.

In Term 4, students will receive their timetable.

If there are any clashes with student classes once the 2024 timetable has been finalised, the careers team will be in contact to discuss options.

Students can log on to the Kurnai College website and access the Student Handbook that details all the subjects for 2024 at the following address: Kurnai Handbook (kurnaicollege.vic.edu.au)

Commencing in 2024, Virtual School Victoria will be operating a new blended learning hub in Morwell, where students will be able to access select VCE subjects not otherwise available at their secondary school, through a blend of face-to-face and online learning. The Hub will be located at the Morwell campus of TAFE Gippsland, and will be co-located with the high-tech Gippsland Tech School. *At this stage, VCE Politics (comprising Australian and Global Politics Units 1&2, Australian Politics Units 3&4, and Global Politics Units 3&4) would be the only subjects not offered at the uni campus. Please see careers if you want to hear more about this.

College Review

All public schools in Victoria have a four-year strategic plan and we are currently undergoing our school review which takes place at the end of one plan and helps to inform the direction of the next plan. Our reviewer is Rob Miller who is appointed by the Department of Education to lead the review and prepare a report that can inform the development of strategic goals for the school to work toward over the next four years. Forming part of the review team are challenge partners who on this occasion are three Principals of other secondary schools, our senior education improvement leader, and our regional director.

The review team have met with the college Principal team and discussed our pre-review self-evaluation and have begun field days where they observe a range of classes across all campuses and speak with focus groups of students, staff and parents. There are numerous student and staff groups that cover the range of year levels, programs, supports, and levels of leadership that are running over three field days. We are also holding a number of parent focus groups across the college.

I would like to extend a big thanks to all the parents who have been able to meet with the review team and share their feedback on what we are doing well and where we could improve. We have our final field day on Tuesday and then convene at the end of term to receive the final report and develop goals for our next strategic plan.

This is an important part of our operations to ensure we are continually focused on getting better and providing our students the best education possible and we are grateful to everyone who is having input into the review.

We want our Parents/Caregivers/Guardians to tell us what they think!

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents / caregivers / guardians think of our school. The Parent / Caregiver / Guardian Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education that is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of families' perceptions of school climate, student behavior, and student engagement. The survey is optional but we encourage families to participate. Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies. A random sample of approximately 30% of parents / caregivers / guardians has been selected to participate in this year's survey. Information on completing the survey has been emailed to those families.

The Parent / Caregiver / Guardian Opinion Survey is open from **Monday 7 August to Friday** 8 **September 2023.**

The survey is conducted **online**, only takes **20 minutes** to complete, and can be accessed at any convenient time within the survey period on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones. The online survey will be available in English and 10 other languages including Arabic, Greek, Hakha Chin, Hindi, Japanese, Punjabi, Simplified Chinese, Somali, Turkish, and Vietnamese.Please contact your campus office if you would like more information.




