Hello Everyone.

The Year 12 VCE session is brought forward so teachers and parents can share information and support students over the last few months of their secondary schooling. This will help them to successfully complete their subjects and prepare for the exams. I strongly urge all Year 12 VCE parents to book times to meet with the teachers.

On the subject of preparation, a number of Year 11 students have spoken to me recently about how hard they have found the shift from Year 10. 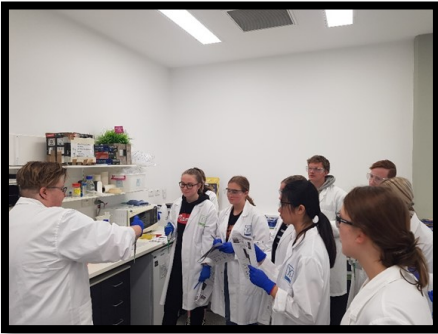

## WE WANT OUR PARENTS TO TELL US WHAT THEY THINK!

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents think of our school. The Parent Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education and Training that is conducted amongst a sample of randomly selected parents. It is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of parents' perceptions of school climate, student behaviour and student engagement. Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies.

Approximately 30 per cent of parents will be invited to participate in this year's survey. All responses to the survey are anonymous. This year the Parent Opinion Survey will be conducted from **Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> July** to **Sunday 11th August 2019**.

The survey will be conducted **online**, only takes **10-15 minutes** to complete, and can be accessed at any convenient time within the fieldwork period on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones. The online survey will be available in a range of languages other than English. These include: Arabic, Vietnamese, Mandarin, Chin (hakha), Hindi, Japanese, Somali, Turkish, Punjabi and Greek.

The survey results will be reported back to the school at the end of September.

VTAC is the body that coordinates tertiary (University) applications for undergraduate degrees and some TAFE courses. VTAC also manages the scholarship application process and special consideration through the SEAS (special entry access scheme). Applications for University for 2020 open through VTAC on August 5, 2019.

The Careers team will arrange information and registration sessions with all Year 12 students in the upcoming weeks. Students have until the 30<sup>th</sup> of September to get their timely applications in.

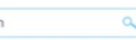
