

Dear Parents and Students,

VicRoads is excited to offer some additional opportunities for students to sit for their learner permit test at the **Morwell** Customer Service Centre on Saturday **17th October**. We would like to thank the community for their patience during this unprecedented year and we are looking forward to helping students start the journey towards getting their drivers' licence. Unfortunately, if you reside in the Cardinia Shire, the Shire of Yarra Ranges or the City of Casey you are unable to participate in this additional opportunity until DHHS ease restrictions for Metropolitan Melbourne.

To assist as many students as possible, the learner permit tests will be paper based and will not have an audio option available. Please re assure your student that the format of the questions however remains the same (32 questions with 3 possible answers) as what they may have practiced on the VicRoads website. If you feel that your student requires audio support, please disregard this information and contact us to book an appointment between Monday and Friday when we can guarantee a computer-based test with audio support.

To ensure that we comply with social distancing, indoor capacity limitations and cleaning requirements we will be able to book a **limited number of** students in every hour commencing at 8.30am. We will take bookings for the 6 morning sessions starting from 8.30am. Please book online via the VicRoads website, on the 13 11 71 call centre number or in person at the Morwell office.

For students or parents/guardians booking at the **Morwell** office payment of \$24.60 will be taken at that time. Once successful, the cost of issuing a learner permit on the day of testing is \$25.20.

Please ensure that the licence or learner permit application form, located here <u>https://rb.qv/qksvru</u>, is filled in prior to arrival and that all Evidence of Identity documents <u>https://rb.qv/pnvnza</u> are also brought to the appointment. If these documents are not presented the test cannot go ahead. Please note that if bringing a Birth Certificate, commemorative certificates are not accepted and only A4 size original Australian Birth Certificates will be accepted.
